The Department of International Studies, Glendon College, York University invites applications for a ten-month (August 15, 2010 to June 14, 2011) Contractually Limited Appointment (CLA) position.

CONTEXT: Glendon College is the bilingual (English-French) liberal arts Faculty of York University. It offers a variety of programs in the humanities and social sciences. It is located on a separate, mid-town campus.

POSITION: Duties will include teaching at the undergraduate level, research and administrative responsibilities. The successful candidate must be bilingual and be able to teach in English and French.

CANDIDATES: The successful candidate must demonstrate commitment to teaching and research in International Studies in a bilingual, interdisciplinary and multicultural context, hold a PhD in Economics (or close to completion), with **specialization in international economics and international economic development**, and have publications and current research projects in the field.

APPOINTMENT: Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The appointment will commence on **August 15, 2010**. All positions at York are subject to budgetary approval.
