The ideal candidate is an established scholar with extensive academic leadership experience at the minimum level of Associate Dean. They will be a highly effective collaborator, relationship builder and communicator, and have a collegial leadership style. The incumbent has experience fostering and mentoring excellence in teaching and research, supporting colleagues, and building and maintaining strong interdisciplinary relationships within and outside the University. As an effective and articulate advocate and spokesperson, the incumbent has a track record of developing and maintaining the institutional, community, and industry-related partnerships that are indispensable to the Faculty's success. They bring administrative experience, strong analytical and problem-solving skills, and financial acumen. They are comfortable and capable at the senior leadership table, making decisions that represent the Faculty and the interests of its students and the University more generally. The incumbent is a leader with high integrity, and demonstrates a commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion in all that they do.
