

VICE-PRESIDENT ACADEMIC AND PROVOST

Concordia University of Edmonton (CUE) is a community of learning grounded in scholarship and academic freedom, preparing students to be independent thinkers, ethical leaders and citizens for the common good. - Strategic and operational planning experience at a senior level.
- Knowledge of academic programs, with a commitment and ability to advance the quality and content of programs, courses, initiatives and the student learning experience.
- Demonstrated ability to work collegially as a team member with a variety of teams and stakeholder groups.
- Senior academic and administrative leadership experience, in a complex organization or environment.
- Inspiring leader, with demonstrated ability to lead through significant change.
- The successful candidate must be able to provide a satisfactory Criminal Records Check.

- Current curriculum vitae;
- Official transcripts of all graduate-level courses;
- A statement describing past experience in activities that promote diversity, equity and inclusion.
