The Department of Language Studies (DLS) at the University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM) invites applications for a full-time tenure stream appointment in Education Studies. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor, with an expected start date of July 1, 2022, or shortly thereafter.

The successful candidate must have earned a PhD or equivalent doctoral degree in Education or a related field by the start date of appointment, or shortly thereafter, with a demonstrated record of excellence in both research and teaching. We seek candidates whose research and teaching interests complement and enhance our existing <u>departmental strengths</u>. The successful candidate will be expected to pursue innovative and independent research at the highest international level and to establish an outstanding, competitive, and externally funded research program.

Candidates must provide evidence of excellence in research through publications in top-ranked and field-relevant academic journals or forthcoming publications meeting high international standards, presentations at significant conferences, research grants and awards, and strong endorsements by referees of high standing.

Evidence of excellence in teaching can be demonstrated through innovations in teaching as evidenced in current and proposed course syllabi (see below), teaching accomplishments, strong letters of reference, and the teaching dossier (with required materials outlined below). Candidates must be able to teach in English at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. A demonstrated ability to coordinate and develop a university-level academic program is an asset.

We seek candidates with research expertise in Educational Language Technology Innovation & Development who are experienced in the creation and use of impactful language-learning technologies for face-to-face, hybrid, and online learning environments. Using design thinking expertise, candidates must bring a background in prototyping, experimentation, and critical thinking that includes but is not limited to augmented/virtual reality, data driven learning and/or app development. Preference will be given to individuals with demonstrated experience in language learning technology for indigenous languages or languages currently taught within DLS (Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hindi, Italian, Latin, Persian, Punjabi, Sanskrit, Spanish and Urdu).

The successful candidate will teach undergraduate courses in educational language technology, design thinking and innovation in the Education Studies program and participate in the experiential learning activities offered by the Department. The successful candidate will also teach graduate courses in the Language and Literacies Program (LLE) at OISE on the St. George campus and will be expected to contribute to the education, training & supervision of undergraduate and graduate students.

The Department of Language Studies is home to transformative university experiences offering a blend of research, innovative pedagogies, and experiential learning opportunities. <u>Education Studies</u> serves students interested in broadening their understanding of teaching, facilitation, and training. Applicants must submit: 1. a cover letter; 2. a curriculum vitae; 3. a statement outlining current and future research interests; 4. two representative publications; 5. a teaching dossier that includes a teaching statement, sample syllabi and course materials from previously taught courses, along with teaching evaluations; 6. two proposed syllabi for courses that the successful candidate would be required to teach namely: i) an innovative syllabus for any one of the following courses: EDS100: Introduction to Education Studies, EDS345 Design Thinking or EDS300 Learning Design and ii) a syllabus for a new advanced course in the applicant's area of expertise); 7. a diversity statement as it relates to teaching and research as outlined above.

Applicants must provide the name and contact information of three references. The University of Toronto's recruiting tool will automatically solicit and collect letters of reference from each referee once an application is submitted (this happens overnight). At least one reference must comment on the applicant's teaching abilities. Applicants remain responsible for ensuring that referees submit letters (on letterhead, signed and dated) by the closing date of **January 26th, 2022**.
