
Definite Term Lecturer, Accounting

The School of Accounting and Finance in the Faculty of Arts at the University of Waterloo invites applications for two lecturer positions in Accounting beginning September 1st, 2022. Successful candidates will focus on any of the areas of Accounting defined broadly (Financial/Integrated Reporting, Managerial, Audit, Tax, AIS) and will be hired at the rank of Lecturer for a two-year definite-term contract, renewable in accordance with university policy. The teaching load is normally 60% of one's tasks (6 courses a year), with service activities in support of the School, the Faculty, the University, and/or the profession amounting to the other 40%.

Preference will be provided to candidates with a Canadian Chartered Professional Accountant designation and/or candidates who have teaching experience in a program leading students towards a CPA designation. Successful candidates will have demonstrated strong potential for teaching in a post-secondary setting in Canada. A high potential for academic leadership including curriculum development is expected of the successful applicant. The capacity to teach and develop course materials in a multi-subject, integrated program such as the Master of Accounting at the University of Waterloo as well as an understanding of CPA educational requirements/pathways leading to a CPA designation are an asset. While not required, capacity to teach sustainability, data analytics or ethics would be viewed positively. Candidates who can demonstrate Thought Leadership and are interested in executive education or pedagogical innovation will be considered positively.

The School is widely recognized for its research and academic programs. We value academic diversity and offer a collegial and stimulating environment that promotes collaboration, intellectual curiosity, and growth. The School offers eight different programs, including five bachelor degrees, 2 master degrees and one PhD degree and attracts top students from Canada and abroad.
