

**LANGUAGE TRAINING CENTRE FOR STUDIES IN FRENCH
YORK UNIVERSITY, GLENDON COLLEGE**



York University, Glendon College - The Language Training Centre for Studies in French invites applications for a one-year contractually-limited appointment to commence July 1, 2015. This position falls within the purview of the French as a second language (FSL) program of the Language Training Centre for Studies in French.

CONTEXT: Glendon College is the bilingual (French-English) liberal arts Faculty of York University. It offers a variety of programs in the humanities and social sciences. It is located on its own separate, mid-town campus.

POSITION: The successful candidate will be responsible to: teach and coordinate courses with multiple sections of French as a second language; manage working groups for these courses, and follow-up with students enrolled in these courses. The successful candidate will teach French as a second language at the undergraduate level following the task-based theoretical framework developed and applied at the Centre. Given Glendon's bilingual mandate, the selected candidate will also participate actively in College-wide activities in both French and English.

The successful candidate will be bilingual (French-English) and have: a Masters or PhD in applied linguistics or in second language acquisition or teaching; experience in teaching second languages using a task-based approach and genres based approach; a good understanding of second language learning in a minority setting; expertise in technology supported teaching; experience teaching French for academic purposes; experience coordinating multi-section courses; capacity for innovation; experience with developing different types of courses (hybrid, on-line, experiential); knowledge of the theories of socio-discursive interactionism.

APPOINTMENT: Initial salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. All positions at York University are subject to budgetary approval.
