The Economics Department, Glendon College at York University invites highly qualified applicants to apply for a *Contractually Limited Appointment (CLA)*, *professorial stream*, for a period of one year, renewable up to two years, in any field of economics, to commence July 1, 2023.

Candidate Qualifications:

- Degree: a PhD, or PhD near completion by the start date, in economics or a related field is required.
- Research/Practice Expertise:
 - Clearly articulated program of research and specialization in any field of economics.
 - Engaged in outstanding, innovative, and, as appropriate, externally funded research at the highest level.
 - Research excellence (or promise thereof) of a recognized international calibre, as evident in: the research statement; publications (or forthcoming publications) with significant journals in the field; presentations at major conferences; awards and accolades; and strong recommendations from referees of high standing.
- Teaching:
 - Excellence (or promise thereof) in teaching, as evident in: the teaching statement; teaching accomplishments and pedagogical innovations (e.g., high priority areas such as experiential education and technology enhanced learning); teaching evaluations; strong letters of reference.
 - Suitability for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies, given that the position may involve graduate teaching and supervision.
- Additional: Given Glendon's bilingual mandate, the selected candidate will also be expected to be fluent in both English and French, to be able to teach as well as participate actively in College-wide service activities in both languages.

Hiring Policies:

- Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
- All York University positions are subject to budgetary approval.
- All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens, permanent residents and Indigenous peoples in Canada will be given priority.
